OPEN HUNTING ATTRACTS MANY

Asheville, Oct. 31.-Open seasons on large and small game have proved an attraction for sportsmen from many sections of the United States now scjourning in the mountain region of Western North Carolina. Seasons on deer and black bear opened October first and open periods for bagging smaller game also were inaugurated on that date.

Hunters in this section and in oth er sections of the United States have in past seasons secured many deer and black bear in the mountain forests, a large number having been bagged each season during the Pisgah national game preserve hunt held over a period of years in the area. No announcement has as yet been made by National Forest officlais as to whether a 1939 hunt will be held in the preserve.

The deer and bear seasons extend from October first to January first, with season bag limits being set at two bear and three deer per hunter. Smaller game seasons include opossum and raccoon, Oct. 1 to Feb. 15 with no seas in limit; rabbit, Nov. 30 to Feb. 15 with no limit; squirrel Oct. 1 to Jan. 15, ten per day and 150 season limit.
