High School Students Hold Panel Discussion At Men's Club Supper

Members of the Men's Club at their meeting last Thursday evening in the Womens Club building, heard Ladd Hamrick, Jr., president of the Senior Class, lead a group of students in a panel discussion on "What Is Education for the American Way of Life?"

Students participating in the discussion were: D. F. Hord Jr., Hal Olive, Gloria Cornwell, Mary Julia Pollock, Ben Goforth Jr., Vivian Prince, Betty Lee Neisler and Eugene Mathis.

In attempting to define Education for the American Way of Life, the leader presented five questions for the group to discuss: 1. What is National Education Week? What is the theme of the Week for 1939? 2. What is Education for the American Way of Life? 3. Is North Carolina educating for the American Way of Life? 4. Is Kings Mountain educating for the American Way of Life?

The students concluded that even though Kings Mountain is educating for the "American Way of Life," she could secure better results by adding courses in vocational training, such as a department of diversified occupations offering carpentry, textiles, mechanics, plumbing, tin work and vocational guidance; and increasing the home economics department and the commercial department each to include an additional year. These additions to the high school course of study are especially needed because only thirty per cent of the graduates receive additional training.

The program was presented in celebration of American Education Week which was observed throughout the United States last week.

The program committee was composed of Supt. E. N. Barnes, Dr. L. P. Baker and Harold Coggins.
