U. S. LINES TO OPEN SERVICE TO ITALY

New York, Dec. 19.—The United States liner Manhattan sails Dec. 30 to inaugurate the lines' passenger-freight service from this country to Italy.

The Manhattan and the Washington will engage in the trade, thus putting U. S. Lines back on the Atlantic after their removal recently because of the neutrality law.

The company asked the permission Nov. 28 and it was granted yesterday by the maritime commission.

Officials said arrangements were made to avoid unnecessary competition with the American Export lines already operating through the Mediterranean.
