Boll Wevil Control

J. O. Rowell. Extension entomolo gist of State College, says that en-couraging reports of boll weevil control through the 1-1-1 molasses poisoning treatment continue to pour in to his office. As an example of the effectiveness of the control measures advocated by the Extension Service, Rowell quoted following report from F. W. Reams assistant farm agent in Hallfax County.

"Three farmers - C. H. Smith of Scotland Neck, R. Hunter Pope of Enfield, and J. G. Shields of Scotland Neck - averaged 499.7 pounds of lint per acre on 276 acres treated with the molasses poison.

Farmers not using potson made average yields of from 150 to 200 pounds of lint per acre, with a num ber of growers reporting less than

pounds per acre on 37 acres, where the cotton was grown on land that Mr. and Mrs. M. A. Ware, Miss had a good growth of lespedeza ne holidays with relatives in Char average of 498 pounds of lint per ocres. Mr. Shields gr 493 pounds per acre on 28 acres.

Rowell explained that treatment consists of mixing one pound of calcium arsenate with one gallon of water and one gallon of cheap molasses, and mopping cotton beginning several days fore the squares form, and continuing at the rate of one application per week until at lest three applications are made.
