Farm Questions

Q.—How much land should be prepared for a home garden?
A.—This depends upon the size of the family and to some extent on the crops desired. One-tenth of an acre will produce an abundance of vegetables for one person and leave some surplus for canning. However, if such crops as watermelons, cantaloupes, Irish and sweet potatoes are grown in the garden proper, then a slightly larger acreage will be needed. If these are grown outside the garden, half an acre of land will be sufficient for a family of five.
Q.—What do you mean by a "full ration" for the dairy cow?
A.—A full ration simply means that the animal is receiving sufficient feed to maintain her body and also to produce milk in maximum quantity. Body maintenance comes first and if there is not enough feed to keep up the body and produce milk then the milk production will suffer and the animal classed as non-profitable. Extension Circular No. 193 gives full direction for proper feeding and care of the dairy animal and a copy may be had free upon application to the Agricultural Editor at State College.
