Jefferson Standard Reports Big Gains

Harry E. Page, local representative of the Jefferson Standard Life Insurance Company, of Greensboro, N. C., has received the annual report of the Company's operations in 1939, as presented by President Julian Price at the annual meeting of the stockholders and directors.

Payments to policyholders and beneficiaries amounting to \$6,350,000; an increase in assets of approximately \$7,500,000 which makes total assets \$87,500,000, and continuation of the highest net interest on invested assets of any major insurance company were reported.
