Manpower, of course, isn't meter ed out like mechanical horsepower. and the estimate of a million man hours doesn't mean that a million man — and women — could have made the picture in an hour.

Nor does it signify that Produces David O. Selznick, working alone eight hours a day, 310 days a year, Hiking: Roy Smith, 4; . Charles could have made the picture in 400 years. But it does given an idea of the magnitude of what is, in many respects, the most tremendous single production task ever attempted in the motion picture industry.

The figure of a million man-hours was reached by adding together the total time for all persons employed on the picture, including the stars, Clark Gable, Vivien Leigh, Leslie Howard and Olivia de Haviland; the director, Victor Fleming, and nearly 5000 other persons who have worked since the picture began.
