

Convention Offers Savory Week

RALEIGH.—A five day program packed full of education, recreation and entertainment is awaiting rural people who attend Farm and Home Week at N. C. State College, July 29-August 1.

Extension Service, and Miss Ruth Current, State home agent, said this year's program is expected to strike the best balance between instruction and entertainment in years.

Reports from every section of the State indicate a record-breaking attendance this year. With AAA committeemen scheduled to attend, the enrollment may reach 2,500. In years past, attendance has averaged between 1,500 and 2,000.

Joint sessions of men and women will be held each of the five days except Thursday to begin each day's program. Following this session, the two groups will break up into separate meetings where they will receive instruction in a wide variety of subjects.

Each evening will be turned over to recreation. Included on these programs will be games, contests, music, group singing, and square dancing.
