
The pullets confined to the dry bare lots usually are pale faced, pale legged, and appear unthrifty. In sharp contrast to this condition, pullets grown on clean range on which no chickens have been two years carry a generous supply of rich yellow pigment in shank and around their faces and have bright red combs and wattles.
