

Dr. Ernest East, a Pittsburg chemistry professor, has perfected a process that will turn our high grade gasoline from molasses in two hours at a reasonable cost.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has given final approval of a program designed to improve marketing conditions for peanut growers by diverting surplus peanuts of the 1940 crop.

Of the 29 CCC camps now operating in North Carolina, 23 are under the direction of the U. S. Forest Service and 6 are under the National Park Service.

Forty percent of the counties of the U. S. have no general hospitals leaving 17 million people without hospitalization facilities.

Fatalities in Cleveland County

Eight of the 498 street and highway fatalities in North Carolina the first eight months of 1940 occurred in Cleveland county, the Highway Safety Division reported this week.

Only 11 of the 100 counties in the State had a clear record in traffic deaths at the close of the eighth month, these being Camden Caswell Chowan, Clay, Gates, Greene, Hyde Mitchell, Perquimans, Tyrrell and Yancey.

Mecklenburg topped the state with an eight-months traffic toll of 25, followed closely by Guilford and Robeson with 22 each, Forsyth with 21 and Buncombe with 19. 16 counties reported only one fatality each for the eight-months period.

The State's eight-months traffic toll of 498 deaths, subject to the possible addition of a few delayed deaths, was a decrease of seven percent from the 539 traffic deaths in the state the first eight months of 1939.

"Happily, North Carolina still enjoys a decrease in its traffic toll for this year in comparison with that of last year, but our percentage of decrease has slipped in two months from ten percent to seven percent," stated Ronald Hocutt, director of the Safety Division. "The fact that we are showing a decrease in the face of a nation-wide increase is gratifying, of course, but eternal vigilance and care on the part of every North Carolina motorist, pedestrian and bicycle rider must be exercised thruout the remainder of the year if we are not to lose what we have gained."

Provisional figures show a total of 71 traffic deaths in the state last month against 82 for August, 1939. This was better than a 13 percent increase.

Not a single bicycle or railroad crossing fatality was reported for the month of August, and the 18 pedestrian fatalities, representing approximately 25 percent of the month's traffic toll, were well below the national average.
