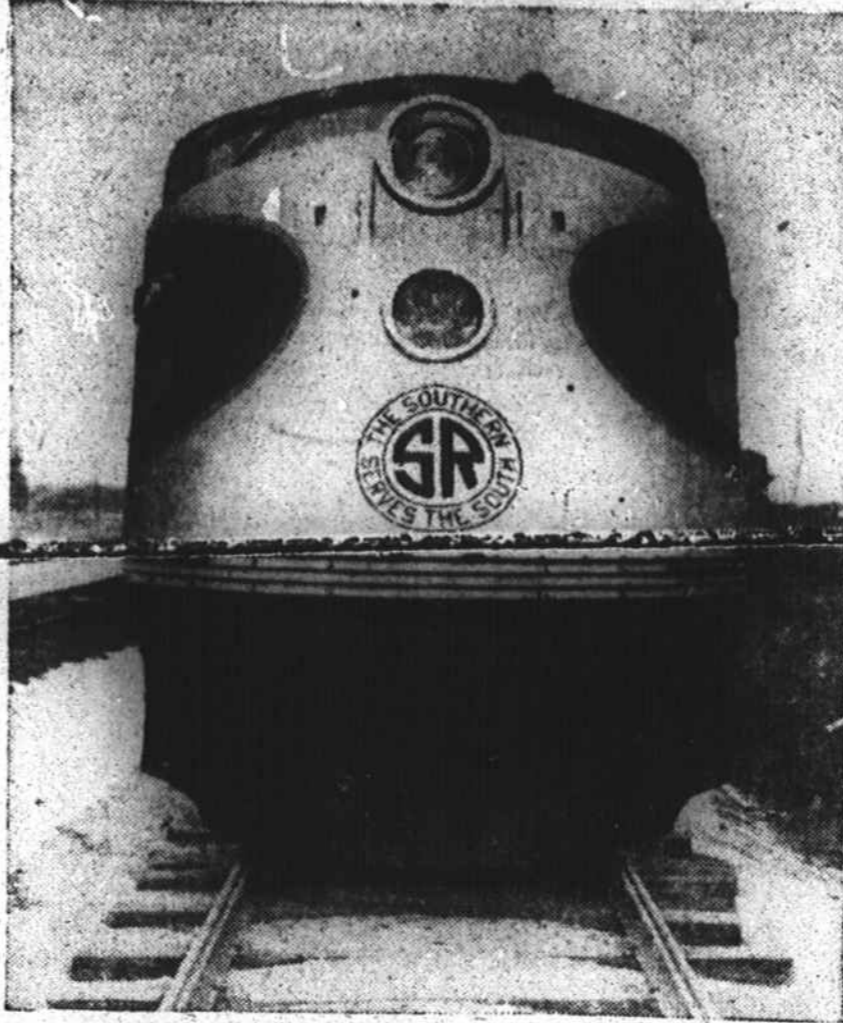

The "Southerner" Passes Through Here



"The Southerner," the country's newest deluxe all-coach streamlined passenger train, scheduled to go in service between New York and New Orleans on April 1, was christened in New Orleans Monday, March 17. Leaving New Orleans March 19th, the new Southern Railway streamliner will make a pre-service exhibition tour of the cities between New Orleans and New York, stopping for public inspection at Slidell, La.; Hattiesburg, Laurel, Meridian, Miss.; Tuscaloosa, Birmingham, Anniston, Ala.; Atlanta, Ga.; Greenville, Spartanburg, S. C.; Gastonia, Charlotte, Salisbury, High Point, Greensboro, N. C.; Danville, Lynchburg, Charlottesville, Va.; and will be on display in Washington, D. C. on March 28th, announces Frank L. Jenkins, passenger traffic manager of Southern Railway System.

The 1941 Madri Gras queen, Miss Delphine Clark, broke a quart of old champagne over the prow of the green and silver Diesel electric locomotive at the New Orleans Terminal Station at noon Monday, March 17th, and special guests at this occasion were nine of the Southern Governors who were in New Orleans attending the Southern Governors' conference.

"The Southerner" will reverse six of the states represented by these governors.

The crack streamliner passed through here Monday afternoon about 3:30 and a considerable number of Kings Mountain citizens lined the tracks to get a glimpse of the modern luxurious train, which was on its way to Gastonia for exhibition. Citizens from the Best Town in the State were unusually interested in the Southern's new Streamliner because Miss Jean Ware, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. A. Ware is a hostess, and Captain O. C. O'Farrell, retired main-line Conductor, was a special invited guest on the train when it passed through here. Captain O'Farrell accompanied the train on its exhibition tour from Atlanta to Charlotte. Both Miss Ware and Captain O'Farrell waved to the Kings Mountain spectators as the train passed here. Several from Kings Mountain motored to Gastonia that evening to inspect the train, as it was stationed there for two hours.

A REPORT to America
