Supt. O. E. Camp Transferred to Moore's Creek

Oswald E. Camp, first superintendent of the Kings Mountain National Military Park, a position held for several years, has been transferred to the superintendency of the Moore's Creek National Military Park near Wilmington. He assumed his new duties January 16th. He succeeded at Kings Mountain by Mr. Fenton.

Mr. Camp has been in the Federal park service for many years, most of his service having been in the Western Parks. However, he came to Kings Mountain from the State of Liberty on Bedloe's Island in New York harbor.

During his administration, many improvements have been made at the Kings Mountain Park. An administration building was erected to house the offices and a museum, a superintendent's home is now in course of erection, roadways have been greatly improved, an open-air auditorium arranged and a staff made

towards centering the forest to its primeval condition through the replanting of native trees where they had been cut out, the restoration of old trails and in many other ways.
 During his tenure of office at the Kings Mountain Park Mr. Camp has resided at York, S. C., where he and Mrs. Camp have made many friends who, along with friends in many nearby towns, regret that they were transferred.
 It was at Moore's Creek on February 27, 1776, that the Revolutionary forces under Colonel Richard Caswell defeated completely a force of 1500 Loyalists under command of Donald McLeod and put an end to British operations in Eastern Carolina for a long time. Small in area this park is a place of unusual historic interest. It was established by an act of Congress of June 2, 1926.
