Mr. Paul Manney has been appointed Kings Mountain chairman of the campaign by the American Legion Auxiliary to collect North Carolina women to the U. S. Marine Corps Women's Reserve.

The appointment was announced today by Mrs. Nellie P. Johnson of Bladenboro, state president of the Auxiliary's drive to call North Carolina women of the need of the U. S. Marines for women to fill home-front jobs and free male Marines for combat duty.

The local Auxiliary will use every means available from July 15th to August 15th, which has been designated as "Free A Marine To Fight South" by Governor J. Melville Broughton, to relay the message of the Leaflets to women between 20 and 34. Mrs. Johnson declared:

"Basic pay and subsistence allowances will mean that women Marines will receive \$132.50 a month, plus clothing, medical, dental and hospital care, and the regular low cost insurance which is available to me." Mrs. Johnson pointed out:

"These women Marines will take over Marine duties inside the United States in more than 60 occupations: Communications, aviation, ground work office and administrative jobs are the more important of those which will be filled by women."
