MEATS, FATS: Red stamps AS TO, good indefinitely.
PROCESSED FOODS: Blue stamps AS through Q2, good indefinitely.
SUGARS: Sugar stamps 20 and 21, each good for five pounds indefinitely. Sugar stamp 40, good for five pounds of cooking sugar through February, next year.
GASOLINE: In 17 East Coast States, A-20 coupon good through Aug. 31.
FUEL OIL: Periods 4 and 5 coupons, good through September 30.
SHOES: Airplane stamps 1 and 2, good indefinitely.
