Jay Knife Received From Soldier Son

H. E. Murray received from his son, Henry, (somewhere in Burma) a genuine Japanese dagger by mail this week. The longer is one of the jungle war type and the hilt fits on the left. The handle is made of mahogany wood. The blade is as long as that of a razor and is curved so that it would be perfect for the cutting of a Jap neck or jungle vines. The blade is about two inches in width and is around 14 inches long. It fits in a genuine leather case and the fit is that of a tight glove. A smaller case fits under the belt on the inner side of the hilt. This smaller case houses a combination knife sharpener and leather punch which is about four inches in length. Also housed in the smaller case is another compartment in a small razor less fine tempered knife. It is only four inches in length. In fact, the entire set in hilt and case is about 18 to 20 inches long. The knife and case will be on display in the rear of the Murray residence each Sunday, and interested parties are invited to inspect them.

RATION REMINDERS
MEATS, FATS: Red Stamps A5 thru T6 good indefinitely. U.S. V8, and W8 become valid June 1 and remain good indefinitely.
PROCESSED FOODS: Blue stamps A5 through V6 good indefinitely.
SUGAR: Sugar Stamps 20 and 21, each good for five pounds indefinitely. Sugar Stamp 22 becomes good for five pounds June 16. Sugar Stamp 23, good for five pounds of canned sugar through February, next year.
GASOLINE: In 17 East Coast States, A-10 coupons good through August 5.
FUEL OIL: Periods 4 and 5 coupons good thru Sept. 30.
SHOES: Airplane Stamps 1 and 2 good indefinitely.
