**Cpl. Mauney Arrives In Mediterranean Area**

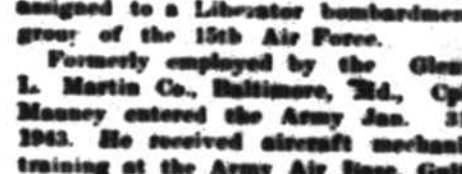
Cpl. James I. Mauney, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. I. Mauney of route 3, has arrived in the Mediterranean theatre of operations and has been assigned to a Liberator bombardier group of the 15th Air Force.

Formerly employed by the Glenn L. Martin Co., Baltimore, Md., Cpl. Mauney entered the Army Jan. 31, 1943. He received aircraft mechanic training at the Army Air Base, Gulfport, Miss., and gunnery training at the Laredo Army Air Field, Texas. After being assigned to a crew as flight engineer, he took combat replacement training at Gowen Field, Boise, Idaho.

The group, of which he is now a member, has flown more than 170 bombing missions against strategic enemy targets throughout central and southern Europe and holds a War Department Unit Citation.
