 MIAMI BEACH, Fla. — Cpl. Leonard B. Leonhardt, 21, of Kings Mountain, N. C., has arrived at Army Air Forces Redistribution Station No. 1 in Miami Beach for reassignment, following after completing a tour of duty outside the continental United States.

Medical examinations and classification interviews at this post, in view of several redistribution stations operated by the AAF Personnel Distribution Command for AAF returnees officers and enlisted men, will determine his new assignment. He will remain at the redistribution station about two weeks, much of which will be devoted to rest and recreation.

Pursuant to provisions of the Charter for the City of Kings Mountain and of the State Laws relative to the conduct of Municipal Elections, and to a resolution duly adopted by the Board of Commissioners on March 13, 1945, an election is ordered to be held Tuesday after the first Monday in May, being May 8, 1945, for the election of five members of the Board of Commissioners for the City of Kings Mountain, one to be elected from each of the five wards, and for the election of three Trustees for the Kings Mountain School District, one each to be elected from Ward No. 4 and No. 5, for a term of six years, and one to be elected from Ward No. 1 to fill out an unexpired term of four years.

Summits in Vietnam
 Of 30 Bomb Missions

Sgt. Charles Gunnells, one of the 11th Airborne Division, who left on April 15 for Shyngbad Field, Tientsin, following a 21-day furlough with his parents, is a veteran of 30 missions as a Liberator aerial gunner over enemy targets in the Balkans, France, Germany and Czechoslovakia.

Included in those 30 missions was a mission in which the pilot crash-landed one in which the pilot crash-landed the plane on Corsica, after two engines had been shot out by flak.

"What made me mad," Sgt. Gunnells said, "is that they had brotrefog for an easy mission. We almost got over the target, a ball-bearing factory in Turin, and then the flak started popping. We almost headed for Switzerland, but I figured we wouldn't have made it over the mountains, then it's a good thing we didn't. If we had made it, we would have been interned."

Leaving toward their home base in Italy, the crew jettisoned the bombs, flak suits and other extraneous equipment into the ocean. They were glad to get out of that one, for which the crew collected Distinguished Flying Crosses.

Sgt. Gunnells says he only got credit for one probable as far as shooting down German fighters was concerned. He saw the bullets ricochet off the plane and saw it go out of sight, but he didn't have time to watch it as six more Jerries were a round at the same time.

Sgt. Gunnells flew back to the United States last October. While on a rest in Cairo, Egypt, he chanced into Major Myron Rhyme of Kings Mountain.

He's not sure about future duty, says it's probably be Super Forts, adds that, with 30 missions behind him, it would be all right for the war to end before he hits combat bomb runs again.

Bullington Promoted

With the 94th Infantry Division in Belgium

Curtis P. Bullington, whose wife, Mrs. Sarah H. Bullington, lives at Kings Mountain, North Carolina, has been promoted to the rank of staff sergeant.

Sgt. Bullington is fighting on the western front with the 64th Infantry Division commanded by Brigadier General A. E. Bolling.

Formerly in the Goebenkirchen sector in Germany, the division was sent to Belgium and played an important part in stopping the German breakthrough.

Brown Star Awarded
 Rogers Posthumously

WITH THE 11TH AIRBORNE DIVISION ON LUZON. — For gallantry attacking a heavily fortified enemy position and killing the three Jap occupants with grenades, after which he brought up a machine gun under intense fire to the newly-seized position and killed 15 additional Jap-pones before he was fatally wounded, Pfc. Arthur L. Rogers, of Route 7, Kings Mountain, N. C., has posthumously been awarded the Bronze Star Medal.

Rogers, who was a paratrooper with the 11th Airborne Division, was cited for his "daring initiative and untiring devotion to duty, which are in keeping with the highest traditions of the armed forces."

The Kings Mountain paratrooper, who was a member of an infantry regiment, had taken part in the overnight dash of his unit from Tagaytay Ridge, in southern Luzon, to the gates of Manila. He was killed during the bloody assault on Fort McKinley, where doughboys armed with flamethrowers, hand grenades, demolition charges and small arms faced concrete pillboxes, reinforced with steel.

He leaves his wife, Arlene Rogers, who lives at the Kings Mountain address.


