AN ORDER AUTHORIZING \$20,000 BONDS FOR REMODELING AND ENLARGING THE SHELDON HOSPITAL

BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Cleveland:

1. That, pursuant to the County Finance Act, as amended, and The County Hospital Act, effective March 15, 1945, bonds of Cleveland County be issued in an amount, not exceeding \$20,000, for the purpose of paying the cost of remodeling and enlarging the buildings which now constitute the Sheldon Hospital and erecting new buildings for said hospital, including the acquisition of the necessary land and necessary equipment.

2. That the same shall be issued for the payment of interest on such bonds at such rate as may be fixed by the commissioners.

3. That a statement of the cost of the same shall be made with the order and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided by law, provided, however, that no such bonds shall be issued under the provisions of this order unless a majority of the qualified registered voters of Cleveland County shall have voted in favor of the assumption by Cleveland County of the outstanding indebtedness of Number Six Township in Cleveland County which was incurred for the purpose of erecting said hospital, and the levy of a county-wide property tax without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment of the principal of and the interest on such indebtedness.

The foregoing order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$37,231,367.00, and the net debt for other than school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$20,000.00. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest. If the same shall be issued, any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of said bonds at a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners to be held at 10:30 o'clock, A. M., May 21, 1945, or an adjournment thereof.

DVOŘAK MEMORIAL

Antonin Dvorak, Bohemian composer, wrote melodies which were recorded as "String Quartette in F Major," Opus 26, in tiny Spillville, Iowa, in 1885. The composition consumed only 12 days. AN ORDER AUTHORIZING \$20,000 BONDS FOR REMODELING AND ENLARGING A COUNTY HOSPITAL IN KINGS MOUNTAIN

BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Cleveland:

1. That, pursuant to the County Finance Act, as amended, and the County Hospital Act (ratified March 15, 1945), bonds of Cleveland County be issued in an amount not exceeding \$20,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of erecting and equipping a county hospital in the City of Kings Mountain, including the acquisition of necessary land.

2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

3. That a statement of the debt of the County has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided by law.

The foregoing order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$37,231,367.00, and the net debt for other than school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$20,000.00. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest. If the same shall be issued, any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of said bonds at a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners to be held at 10:30 o'clock, A. M., May 21, 1945, or an adjournment thereof.
