## Cashion Leads High To 13-7 Win

With 'Iron Man' plunging fullback Bill Cashion setting up the winning touchdown on a 57-yard pass interception gallop, Kings Mountain Central high Mountaineers broke into the win column last Friday night in Bessemer City, defeating the Scrappy Lads by 13 to 7, in a non-conference affair that was hard fought down to the final whistle.

The Mountaineers piled up 119 yards rushing and 120 yards passing to rack up 13 first downs, fumbles and bad kicks robbing the locals other possible scores.

With a crowd of 1500 standing fans watching, J. Dixon passed 32 yards to G. Nickols who went across standing up for the lone Bessemer City touchdown. Dixon tallied the point through center as the first quarter ended.

The Mountaineers started to roll just before the second quarter ended taking the ball over on their own 20 on downs. Jake Harry in at tailback, tossed 30 yards to left end, and game captain, Bill Dettmar, and the

took Mitchem's pass good for 18 yards and another first down as the power machine of the Canipe-lads got underway for paydirt. Cashion bucked center for 3 yards and Mitchem, off tackle, added another first with 9 yards. Mitchem, off tackle again, picked up a first down, followed by Cashion's plunge through center good for the fourth first in a row. Cashion plunged the middle for 14 yards on two tries to make it five in a row, taking the ball down to the 5 yard line. After Cashion recovered his own fumble on the 7, Mitchem raced around his right end for the score. Cashion added the point from scrimmage to knot the score at 7-all.

Bessemer City received the ball on the Mountaineer 33 after an exchange of punts midway of the fourth quarter and took to the air. The Mountaineer forward wall rushed J. Dixon's attempted pass, Dixon dropping back to midfield before firing the ball downfield. Cashion breaking through to intercept the ball in the break of the game for the locals. Lugging the ball behind good mid-field blocking, Cashion raced down to the 10-yard line where he was hauled down by a fleet Bessemer back.

Cashion, on the first play, plunged center for 2 yards, followed by wing-back Dwight Ware's 3 yards on a reverse. Cashion bulled his way through center for 3 on the next try and went over from the 2-yard line for the touchdown. The try for point failed and the Mountaineers were in the lead 13 to 7.

Bessemer came back to rack up two first downs Dixon to C. Shufford, a pass, good for 18 yards, and a first, and Dixon's run good for the other. Kings Mountain took over the ball on downs after Dixon's passes fell

Kings Mountain began a touchdown drive with the kick-off beginning the third quarter, Mitchem running G. Carson's kick back for 17 yards. Cashion picked up 1 yard and then a first down, followed by Mitchem's pass to Black good for 20 yards and another first and ten. Cashion's fumble at this point only delayed the drive and the Mountaineers took over the ball on their own 32 yard line, after the losers punted.
