Bobby E. Ethers, charged with speeding, was taxed with costs of court and T. E. Bell, charged with running over a fire hose, was fined costs.

Clyde McDaniel, charged with abandonment and non-support of his wife and child, was placed under a \$250 bond and ordered to make payments weekly to the clerk of court for the support of his family.
