Kings Mountain Woman's Club Holds Charter Night Program

On Friday evening members, guests, and friends of the Kings Mountain Woman's Club met in the club auditorium to witness a beautifully impressive service, marking Charter Night and installation of new officers.

To quiet strains of piano music played by Mrs. N. F. McGill, the nine Charter members present, Mrs. J. E. Aderholdt, Mrs. E. L. Campbell, Mrs. H. T. Fulton, Mrs. D. C. Mauney, Mrs. H. N. Moss, Mrs. C. E. Neisler, Mrs. B. M. Ormand, Mrs. George Patterson, now of Gastonia, and Mrs. A. H. Patterson entered the auditorium and took their places to the left and in front of a white back drop which bore the seal of the N. C. Federation of Women's Clubs. In front of this background was placed a table bearing a great taper representing the state Federation, with fourteen smaller tapers representing Charter members who have died. Seated on the right were the President of District 4, Mrs. William Edwards, of Rutherfordton, and the retiring president of the Kings Mountain club, Mrs. Aubrey Mauney.

After the invocation given by Mrs. George Patterson, Jack Ruth, last president of the Youth Center, presented to the club a bronze plaque in memory of Mrs. E. A. Shenk, who had been the first youth adviser in their organized activities. A prologue, 1905-1949, was then read by Mrs. Aubrey Mauney. Mrs. H. T. Fulton called the roll of Charter members of the first Civic League (later the Woman's Club) and the list, artistically inscribed and framed by Mrs. Otto Hehn, was presented to the charter members and accepted by Mrs. C. E. Neisler. Three past presidents in the group were Mrs. D. C. Mauney, Mrs. C. E. Neisler, and Mrs. A. H. Patterson. Mrs. E. W. Griffin then explained that the silver offering brought this night by club members would go toward the state headquarters building fund as a gift honoring local Charter members.

After a processional of officers-elect, followed by the installation service was held. As part of this ceremony, each charter member's taper was lighted from the great candle, and as the list of deceased members was read by Mrs. Neisler, Mrs. D. C. Mauney lighted a candle for each. The district president installed the officers, and each signified her readiness to serve by lighting her taper from the Federation candle. New officers for 1949-51 are: President, Mrs. Otto Hehn; Vice-president, Mrs. J. H. Patterson; Recording secretary, Mrs. J. N. Gamble; Assistant Recording secretary, Mrs. P. G. Ratterree; Corresponding secretary, Mrs. H. C. Mayes; Treasurer, Mrs. I. G. Patterson; Custodian, Mrs. Milton Fryer; Chaplain, Mrs. W. L. Pressly; Historian, Mrs. Luther Cansler; Junior sponsor, Mrs. Aubrey Mauney. After each member in the audience had come forward to receive a light from the Federation taper, the entire club joined in the singing of the Clubwoman's hymn. Then through an aisle made by officers and clubwomen, the Charter members led the procession in to

the lounge for refreshments.

Mrs. Luther Cansler wrote and directed the exceptionally beautiful service. Receiving at the door of the auditorium were Mrs. Vernon Crosby and Mrs. W. B. Thomson. The latter was responsible for the programs, while Mrs. Crosby presided

over the table where guests and members signed the register, daintily bound and decorated with sprays of pine cones. Mrs. H. T. Fulton headed the committee for the difficult task of securing an accurate list of the Charter members. Those charter members able to be present were escorted by officers of the junior Woman's Club, Mrs. Craig Falls, president; Mrs. Sam Hamrick, vice-president; Mrs. J. B.
