## Wildlife Body Adds Three Specialists

RALEIGH. — Three native Tarheels have been employed to fill important positions with the Wildlife Resources Commission, according to Clyde P. Patton, Executive Director of the Commission.

"In filling any positions," Patton said, "applications are received from as large a field of applicants as possible. With training, experience, and other qualifications being equal, first consideration is given to North Carolina residents."

The three new employees will work in the Fish and Education Divisions of the Commission. Hayden Monroe Rattledge, a native of Elkin, will work in the Fish Division as a biologist, and has been assigned to work on fish management areas and other front streams in the western part of the state. Rattledge is a graduate of North Carolina University at Chapel Hill, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Zoology and studied fish biology under Dr. R. E. Coker. Currently working as a naturalist at Cliffs of the Neuse State Park near Goldsboro, Rattledge will resign to take up his duties with the Wildlife Resources Commission soon after August 1. He will headquarter at Marion.

Jack Dermid, a native of Charlotte has been employed as a Junior Publicity Specialist with the Commission's Education Division. Dermid graduated from North Carolina State

College, Raleigh, in June, 1949, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Wild Life Management. Dermid has been assigned to duties as a photographer and to assist in the publication of educational material, with headquarters in Raleigh.  
 Miss Lunette Barber of Clayton, has resigned her position as a business teacher with Cleveland Consolidated School in Johnston County to work as a Junior Publicity Specialist with the Commission's Education Division. Miss Barber has been active in leading wildlife study activities at Cleveland school, and will do contact work with schools and organizations interested in wildlife conservation throughout North Carolina. Her headquarters will be in Raleigh.
