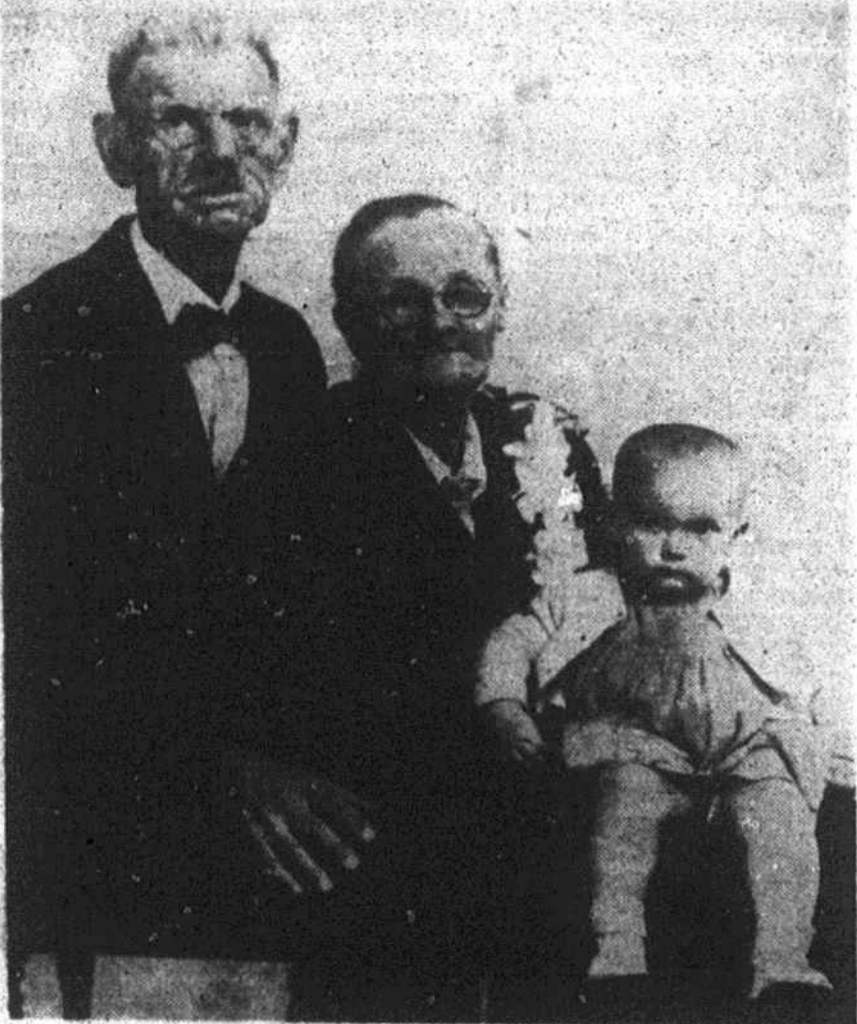

"Uncle Norman," Charlotte photographer, is scheduled to be at Myers' Department Store Monday and Tuesday to take pictures of children.

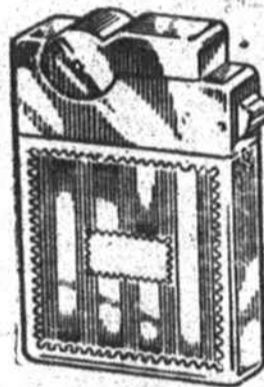
Myers' is offering one photo free to children age six months to six years as a Christmas gift.

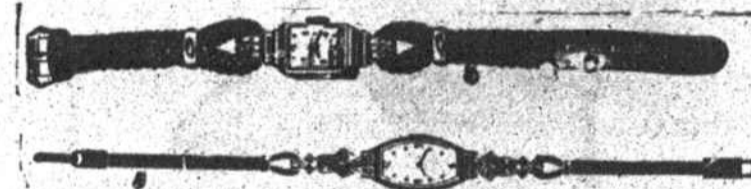
