Bob Jackson, senior left end of the Kings Mountain high school football team, has been named to the Western (Class A) all-conference football team it was announced this week.

The team was named by vote of the loop coaches at a meeting in Hickory Monday night. Schedules for basketball, baseball and football for 1950 were also drawn up at the meeting.

Hendersonville was dropped from the conference roster at the request of the school and Mt. Holly, who has been a member of the conference for other sports, was included in the football membership for 1950.

Charlotte Tech high also announced withdrawal from the loop.

Hendersonville's withdrawal came about before protests of playing ineligible players by the school were aired.
