Dr. Jennings To Speak Here

Dr. Lowell Jennings, of Gastonia, will speak at First Wesleyan Methodist church Thursday evening, January 31 at 7:00 p. m. according to an announcement of Rev. J. W. Phillips, pastor. Dr. Jennings will show some recent pictures of Japan and Korea. He was recently released from Army duty in December, 1951 and will be going to India in the spring as a medical missionary. At present, he is Assistant Public Health Director of Gaston County.

The largest Canadian producer has increased its production of refined nickel approximately five percent in the current year and the output of the second largest producer has also been increased.
