## Commissioner Red Layton Releases Little League Hit, Pitch Averages

Kings Mountain Little League Commissioner Red Layton today released statistics of the league games to date.

The figures give an indication of why the Park Grace and Kiwanis Club teams are tied for the loop lead. Park Grace has a team batting average of .300 and Kiwanis .265.

Leading hitters are: Keith Layton (JC) .592, Ken Conner (Bur) .545, Ben Bumgardner (PG) .489, Ken Bailey (PG) .437, Johnny McGinnis (K) .406, Dave Falls (K) .379, Randy Cash (K) .350, Boyd Smith (PG) .343.

In the pitching department, Jerry Wright (PG) leads with four wins in five starts without defeat. He has pitched 24 innings, allowed 12 runs, 22 hits and struck out 29 and walked 18.

Johnny McGinnis (K) has gone 39 innings in five games for a 3-0 record. He has allowed but three runs on 13 hits, while wiffing 28 and walking 10.

Keith Layton (JC) has a 3-1 record, appearing in 34 innings in 8 games. He has allowed 15 runs and only 8 hits, while holding the league strikeout record with 69. Layton has walked 18.

Randy Cash (K) has a 5-2 record for 8 games, 41 innings. He has allowed 10 runs on 25 hits, while striking out 49 and walking 29.

Ken Bailey (PG) has a 2-1 record, 15 innings. He has allowed 16 runs on 22 hits, with 25 strikeouts and 16 walks.
