Farm Accidents Take Big Toll

Farm work accidents for the past year reached a staggering total both in persons involved and in financial loss. Figures compiled by the U. S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics show that 4,000 persons were involved in fatal farm work accidents. This is pointed out by Howard Clapp, county farm agent for State College Extension Service, in connection with observance of National Farm Safety Week, July 20-26. Permanently disabled totaled 250; loss of arm or leg, 11,400; loss of finger or toe, 30,900; and temporary disability affected 378,000. Farm accidents affected a total of 424,550 persons. Accidents affecting farmers are expected to cost about one billion dollars this year - including fire and motor vehicle and

STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

QUESTION: What control is recommended for the Japanese beetle? ANSWER: The beetles are easily killed with DDT. A 5 per cent dust applied to the infested property damages. For example, four farm buildings will burn every day, according to the National Protection Association, and every 24 seconds a disabling injury will strike some unlucky farm person. About 15,000 farm residents die and about 1,300,000 are injured in rural accidents each year. The farm motor vehicle accident rate strikes down about 6,000 persons and leave 220,000 to suffer injuries from operating motor vehicles each year. For protection of fruits or garden crops which are ready to eat at the time of attack, one should use Methoxychlor, a substitute for DDT which does not leave a harmful residue. PETERBOROUGH, N. H. - A registered Guernsey cow, Karat's Diane, owned by J. C. Randle, Kings Mountain, N. C., had completed an official Advanced Registry record of 10,968 pounds of milk and 498 pounds of butterfat in twice daily milking for a ten-month period, starting her record as a 6 year-old. "Diane" is the daughter of the outstanding Guernsey sire, Klondike Karat, that has 13 daughters

in the Performance Register of the American Guernsey Cattle Club. This record was supervised by the North Carolina State College and was reported to The American Guernsey Cattle Club for approval and publication. Entomologists at N. S. GARDEN TIME ROBERT SCHMIDT N.C. STATE COLLEGE

Most areas in North Carolina receive about 50 inches of rainfall per year. If this were properly distributed it would be ample for our growing crops. But it often isn't evenly distributed, and this season is a very good example. The experts tell us our crops should have an inch of water each week. Many gardens in the State haven't received that much during the last three weeks and at the same time temperatures have been in the 90's. Vegetable crops in particular are severely damaged by extended periods of dry weather. Quality is usually dependent on rapid growth, especially in the case of early vegetables. Any check in growth will make them tough and unpalatable. This is also true of snap beans and root crops. Recently, I have been asked by many persons, "Why do my tomatoes rot before they ripen?" This condition is known as blossom-end rot and is caused in most cases by extended hot, dry weather. It cannot be controlled by spraying. Many a berry crop has been cut down both in quality and yield by the lack of water at the proper time. The answer to this problem is irrigation. But irrigation equipment is expensive. Yes, but if taken care of it will last for many years, and the saving of one crop may in some cases pay the full cost of the equipment. The application of the proper amount of water at the proper time should be worth a great deal to vegetable and fruit growers, and this means putting the water on before the crop is seriously checked in growth by dry weather.
