Local Men Back From Korean Duty

LONG BEACH, CALIF. — Returning here aboard the heavy cruiser USS Saint Paul after spending nearly eight months in the Korean combat area are two Kings Mountain, N. C. men, Charles B. Anthony, electrician's mate fireman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Anthony, and Ensign William P. Gerberding, USN, son of the Rev. W. P. Gerberding.

The Saint Paul spent her time during the cruise ranging the length of North Korea's East Coast from the battle line, at Kosong, to Chongjin, within 50 miles of the Siberian and Manchurian borders. Her duties varied from giving direct gunfire support to United Nations front line troops to the destruction of railway targets near the key Red points of Songjin and Wonsan and the bombardment of North Korean headquarters and supply installations in Chogjin.
