Assault Case Is Court Highlight

Judge Jack White, in regular weekly session of city recorder's court Monday afternoon, disposed of a light docket.

Sam Williams, Negro, was found guilty of assault on Anne Pearl Boyce, Negro, and sentenced to thirty days work on the roads, judgment suspended upon the payment of costs of court.

The prosecuting witness, who testified that the defendant said that he would blow her brains out with a shotgun, also said that she did not wish to prosecute the case, that she and the defendant were "good friends".

Defendant in turn testified that the prosecutress tried to shoot him on the grounds that he was "going around with another woman".

The case, which caused somewhat of a commotion in the courtroom Monday afternoon, came to a head when the sister of the prosecuting witness, who was not a party to the case, came up to the front of the courtroom and asked the judge to see if that her sister refrain from living with the defendant, that she live with her.

With those words the prosecutress, Ann Boyce, walked from her seat, apparently headed to the outer door of the courtroom, collapsed in the floor, allegedly fainting. She had testified earlier that she had been in a nervous state for a long time.

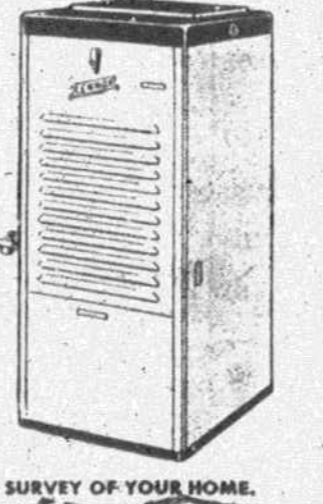
