





AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZ ING \$600,000 SANITARY SEWER

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners (sometimes called the Board of City Commissioners) of the City of Kings Mountain:

Section 1. That, pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, as imended, bonds of the City of Cings Mountain, North Carolin i hall be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$600,000 for the purpose of pro viding funds for enlarging and extending the sanitary sewer system of said City, including the construction of sewage treatment plants and a pumping station, the installation of additional sewer mains and lines, and the acquisition of necessary lands and rights


Section 2. That a tax sufficient o pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the debt of the City has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection. Section 4. That this ordinance

shall take effect when approved by the voters of the City at an election as provided by said Act. The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 13th day of October. 1952, and was first published, on the 30th day of October, 1952.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publica
