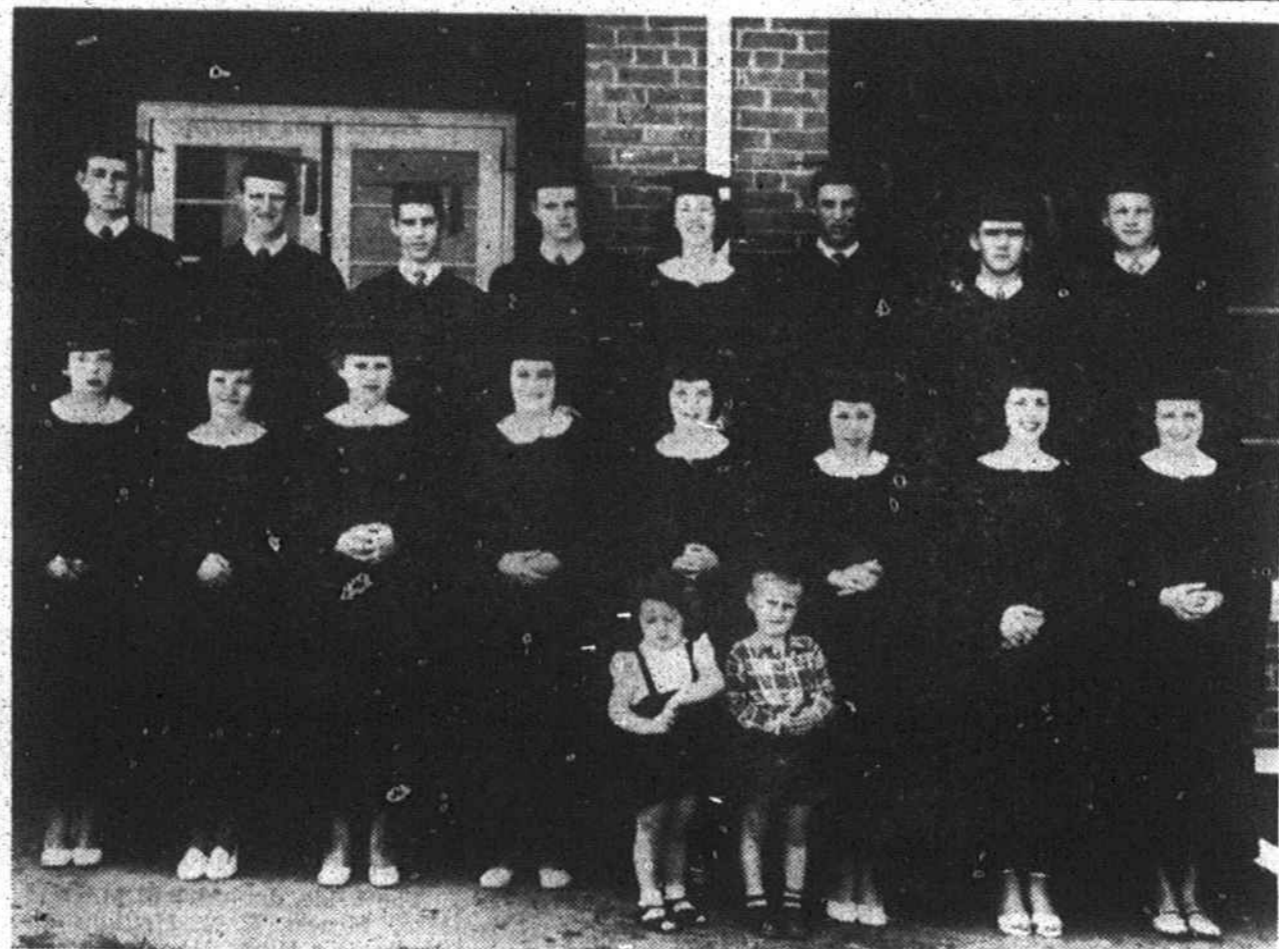

Garden Watering Systems Needed

In ordinary seasons a well-watered kitchen garden produces at least 50 percent more than one that depends entirely on rainfall. And during very dry seasons, regular watering may mean the difference between good batches of high quality vegetables and little or no crop at all.

This extra production, according to Howard Clapp, county agent from the North Carolina State College Agricultural Service, may pay for the costs involved in installing the necessary watering equipment.

Farmers who plan to install watering equipment in their vegetable gardens this year should consider how much garden can be watered efficiently and economically by their present well and pump system.

The quantity of water needed for each application will depend somewhat on the crop and the local conditions, but Mr. Clapp emphasizes that the ground should be wet to full root depth in each watering. Otherwise, shallow rooting is encouraged. One inch of water applied over a period of several hours will usually be sufficient to soak the ground to the proper depth. Water should never be applied at a rate faster than the ground can soak it up.

If a garden watering system has not been used before, Mr. Clapp recommends a check on the capacity of the well. To apply the equivalent of one inch of water to a half-acre garden plot in 24 hours of pumping requires a pump with a capacity of about 550 gallons an hour, Mr. Clapp says.

Charlie Ballard, Kings Mountain businessman and former star high school and American Legion junior player, is a leading member of the Clippers team.

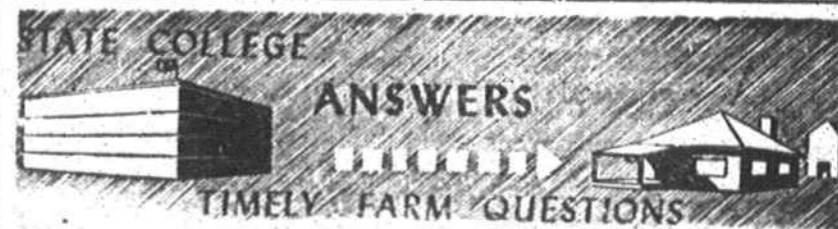
Many Kings Mountain baseball fans follow the two Tar Heel teams regularly and the game is expected to draw a large local turnout.

Damage Suit Filed In Federal Courts

RALEIGH — A \$200,000 damage suit has been filed in Federal Court here as the result of an auto accident near Kings Mountain on June 7, 1952 in which Rita Faye Koplon was killed.

The suit was filed by Robert L. Emanuel, Raleigh lawyer and administrator of Miss Koplon's estate against Edgar E. Peltz of Hampton Roads, Va.

According to the papers in the case, Miss Koplon was accompanying Peltz, a close friend of the Koplon family, to Charlottesville, Va., to attend University of Virginia commencement exercises.



QUESTION: How can I rid my hogs of roundworm?

ANSWER: Sodium fluoride has been found to be a safe and simple drug to use in forming hogs of large intestinal round worms. The round worm is the most common of all worms that may infest hogs, and it causes considerable financial loss to North Carolina hog producers each year. While hogs of any age may be wormed with sodium fluoride, it is generally accepted that the best time is about two weeks after weaning. See your county agent for more complete details.

QUESTION: How can I save fuel when curing tobacco this year?

ANSWER: Proper insulation of your barn is all important. Be sure the side walls and ceiling of the building are properly insulated. If there is much air leakage, these slight repairs will save considerable fuel. Barns having tight double walls with heavy building paper between and solid roof sheathing to prevent air leakage may not need insulation. Your county agent has a new booklet on ridge ventilators, and barn construction in general.

QUESTION: How can I get rid of depluming mites in my chicken?

ANSWER: The depluming mite, a very small parasite which

penetrates the skin of the fowl near the base of the feathers, causes discomfort and may result in the chicken plucking itself by plucking out the feathers at the base of which the mite is located. The parasite is difficult to control. Houses must be thoroughly cleaned as soon as infestation is detected. Affected birds should be removed from the flock and treated individually. Sulphur ointment consisting of one part flowers of sulphur and four parts lard or vaseline may be applied to the affected regions.

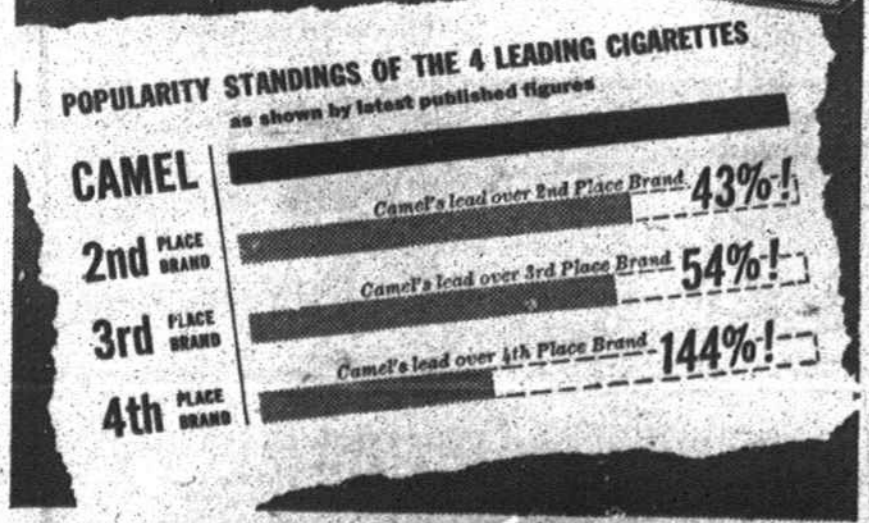
