give record quantities of milk and heavier poundage of butter fat, to improved breeds of hogs whose offspring grow to maturity more quickly, and to stronger strains of cotton, peanuts, tobacco, which are suitable to particular climates and resistant to particular diseases. All the improvements, he said, are results of farm research, which he defined as the application of science to farm problems.

Among recent research achieements of local area interest, Mr. Bumgardner said, is the development of vaccine to prevent fowl typhoid. Work is still underway to perfect a more permanent vaccine, the present one effective. for only about three months, Another project, he reported, is improvement of the well-known Coker 100 cotton seed, to suit all of animal development since the North Carolina's several different climates.

Research has paid off, he said, He pointed to the improvements in all segments of the industry, in marketing as well as animal and plant breeding. Marketing improvements, he reminded, have made it possible for the farmer to become a specialist and get away from a growing policy of self-sufficiency.




