**Dry Weather Brings Insurance Regrets**  
Many a North Carolina farmer is regretting the fact that he turned down the opportunity to insure his crops last spring, but none are more woebegone than farmers in drought-stricken Rockingham County.  
T. D. Williamson, Negro county agent for the Agricultural Extension Service, says farmers who attended a crop insurance meeting last spring and found hundreds of excuses for not joining in a group insurance plan, are perhaps the hardest hit by the two-month-long drought. "It's ironical," says Williamson, "but it's true."  
Quite a few of the farmers who attended the insurance meeting took advantage of the low cost of the group plan, he says. But many others found all kinds of

excuses for not joining the group. "Right now, after talking to these men," Williamson says, "it's hardly necessary to tell you what they wish they had done."  
He says those who took out the insurance are "elated over the fact that they can still take care of their crop expenses and have a few dollars left for other purposes."  
But some farmers in Rockingham haven't been so hard hit by the drought, the farm agent says.

He cites the case of Walter Williamson of the Haw River community. In spite of the dry weather his corn crop is turning out to be one of the best he ever produced. He planted N. C. 27 variety hybrid on good, well-drained bottomland and used good fertilization and cultivation practices.  
Dry weather this summer is expected to cut North Carolina's hay crop 7 per cent below that of last year.

**Educators Held Annual Meeting**

RALEIGH — Some of the most distinguished educators in America gathered here Wednesday in the White Memorial Presbyterian church, and completed plans for the educational study soon to be made of the seven educational institutions supported by the Presbyterian Synod of North Carolina. The Advisory Council to the Educational Survey Commission of the Synod convened jointly with the Commission at 11:00 a. m. and the two bodies met separately during the afternoon. Announcement of the Director of the Survey was made by Dr. Warner L. Hall, minister of the Covenant Presbyterian church, Charlotte, and Chairman of Synod's Committee on Educational Institutions. The survey, which will require a full year, has been made possible by a \$50,000 grant from the Ford Foundation.

Members of the Advisory Council attending the meeting on Wednesday were Dr. Sarah Gibson Blanding, President of Vassar College, Poughkeepsie, N. Y.; Dr. Francis Rosecrance, Dean of Education, New York University, Nashville, Tenn., Sec. of Dept. of Educational Institutions, General Board of Education of the Methodist church; Dr. John D. Millett, Oxford, Ohio, President of Miami University; and Dr. Walter Spragens, Columbia, Missouri, President of Stephens College. Dr. Oliver C. Carmichael, New York, Director of the Carnegie Foundation, and President-elect of the Univ. of Alabama, is a member of the Advisory Committee, but will be unable to attend the meeting.
