State Colleges HINTS TO HOMEMAKERS Miss Ruth Carrent State Home Demonstration Agent

QUESTION: I'm a tobacco farmer and I want to know something about nematodes and how they affect me.

ANSWER: Nematodes are tiny worm-like creatures. Most forms are so small you cannot see them. It is barely possible to see a mature female of some species. We have many types of nematodes in North Carolina soils. Some are harmless to tobacco while others are parasites and live by sucking juices from the plant roots. This is what causes the plant to become diseased. We have two important groups of nematodes that affect tobacco: (1) root knot nematodes and (2) meadow nematodes. These pests feed and reproduce in the roots of a wide variety of plants and live from

year to year in the soil and decay roots. When you grow tobacco and other susceptible crops continuously in infested soil, the nematode population increases until it is no longer profitable to grow these crops.

QUESTION: Have agricultural scientists developed a tobacco that is resistant to nematodes?

ANSWER: No. While some varieties of tobacco in commercial use may withstand nematode attacks somewhat better than others, we don't have highly resistant varieties yet. Experiment Station plant breeders are striving to develop nematode-resistant varieties and to add this resistance to varieties resistant to other diseases such as black shank and the bacterial wilts.
