not require a full eight hours but it is proposed that the deficiency be augmented by parcel post delivery. In other words, after the extensions are approved, you will have three full time routes and an auxiliary parcel post route running between 41/2 and 5½ hours a day.

"5. As discussed with you, most of the streets surveyed have not been provided with street signs or numbers. In an interview with the mayor of Kings Mountain, we were advised that the street signs and numbers would be provided as promptly as possible. It will be recommended that the extensions to the city delivery service be contingent upon the erection of suitable street signs and the provision of house numbers for every house served.

"6 You are familiar with the proposed revisions of Rural Routes 1 and 3 incident to the extension of city delivery service in the cotton mill areas. It will be appreciated if you will advise in writing as to whether you are in agreement with my proposed recommendations.
