**Schoolmen Talk Bond Election**

Kings Mountain, Shelby and Cleveland County school boards were meeting in Shelby at Hotel Charles Wednesday night to discuss plans for a county-wide school construction bond issue election they expect to request of the county board of commissioners.

While purpose of the meeting was to determine amounts required to bring school construction up-to-date, it was anticipated that the county-wide issue request would be in the neighborhood of \$3,000,000.

The total would be shared on the basis of school population between the three units. Kings Mountain district school population approximates 11 percent of the county total.


