Recorder's Court Session Monday

Willis Smith, Negro, and Nathaniel Sweat, Negro, plead not guilty in Recorder's court Monday afternoon. Smith not guilty to speeding 80 miles an hour in a 35 mile zone, and Sweat not guilty to aiding and abetting in speeding. Smith was caught speeding while driving a vehicle belonging to Sweat. Judge Jack White found the defendant Willis Smith guilty as charged, and Nathaniel Sweat not guilty as charged. Sweat stated on the witness stand that he asked Smith to stop when he realized that officer's were signaling for them to stop. Willis Smith was given a 4 month sentence, suspended on condition that he pay a \$35 fine and cost of court. The defendant's drivers license were also revoked by the state.

A new warrant for public drunkenness against J. B. Burris, Negro, who was to be tried on two similar counts, was issued by Judge White. Burris appeared intoxicated in court to answer the counts. Judge White also sentenced the defendant to 5 days in city jail for contempt of court to be served immediately.

Rowland Moss plead not guilty to the count of violating prohibition laws for beverage purposes. The defendant said on the witness stand that he was in the Horsehoe Grill when someone handed him a pint bottle to inspect and that he did not drink any of the contents and after inspecting this bottle handed it back. Judge White continued prayer for judgement for 30 days.

Sarah Smith, Negress, plead guilty to the charge of public drunkenness and was sentenced to be imprisoned in Woman's Prison for a period of 30 days. This sentence is to run concurrently with a 2 year sentence the defendant had received in Bessemer City Recorder's court January 25.

Luther Harris plead guilty to operating a motor vehicle without driving license, and was given a 30 day sentence suspended on condition that he pay a fine of \$25 and costs of court.

Bond in the case of William N. Smith, charged with speeding, was forfeited and a capias was issued for Everett Nelson Howell.

There were two defendants found guilty of public drunkenness, and three cases continued.

State Highway Patrolmen used nearly a million and one half gallons of gasoline in operating their patrol cars over some 700,000 miles of North Carolina highways in 1953.
