

CHICK CHATS

PROFIT DEPENDS ON CHICK'S CARE

The better a baby chick is treated, the more money it will make for its owner. There is no substitutute for good management in the poultry business.

Proper care will not only cause a chick to do better but will also prevent a lot of diseases-often the difference between profit and loss. It's a good practice to start chicks right and to keep them right.

A chick's home should be warm, clean and light. House and equipment should be cleaned and disinfected before the chicks arrive. The brooder stove

should be given a trial run to make sure it is working properly. With this situation to start with, here are some tips that will help turn those chicks into profits:

STORE

Chicks Need Space

1. Your chicks should have plenty of room. Allow one square foot of floor space for every two baby chicks. A 10 by 12 foot house will accommodate 250 chicks. Don't put too many chicks around a single brooder; a good figure is 250 - a better one

2. For 250 chicks, at least 6 two loot feeders should be provided. In the first few days, feed may be placed on paper or egg flats. Have at least 4 one-quart water founts for 250 chicks. If possible place a fount under the hover. At 3 weeks, increase feeders to 5 three-foot troughs and increase waterers to 4 one-gallon

fountains. 3. At the start, you should put down 2 or 3 inches of clean litter. Add to the litter occassionally and keep it fresh and free of dampness. Good ventilation is vital for removal of foul air and moisture. Make sure that the air circulation is steady but gentle with no strong drafts.

Regulate Hoat

4. Start your broader at 95 degrees and reduce the temperature 5 degrees a week until 70 is reached. Chicks should be spread out evenly around the brooder. Use a cardboard guard one foot out from the hover at the start. Move the guard back gradually and remove it entirely about the fifth day.

5. Encourage early roosting. Place low, sloping roosts near the hover at 4 weeks. This will help avoid crowding and foul air. Open windows on warm days for ventilation and direct sunlight. Allow chicks to run outdoors as weather permits.
