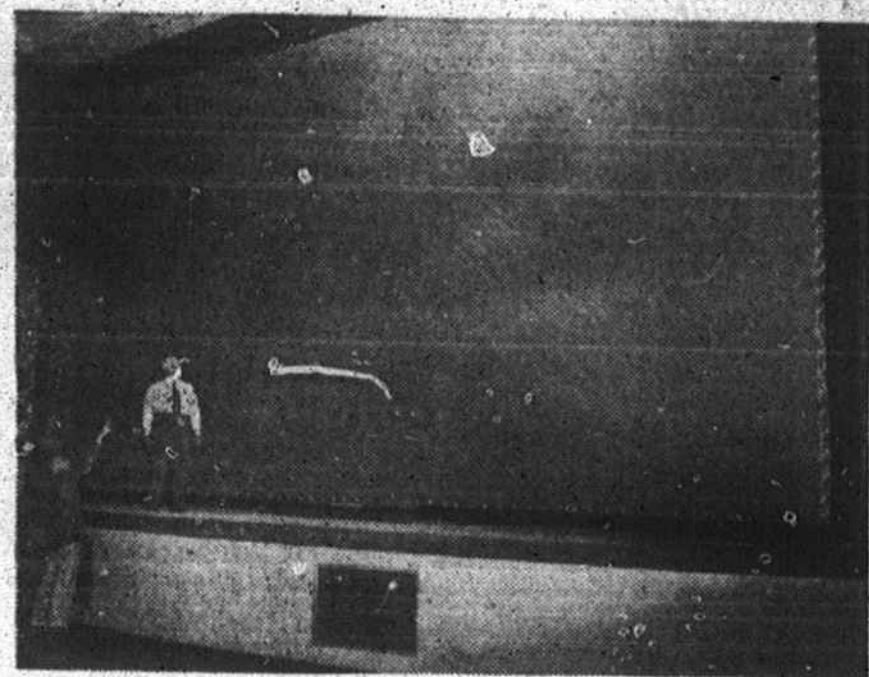


# Cagers Clash With Cherryville Here Friday, Caroleen Tuesday

Kings Mountain high school's Mountaineers are scheduled to continue their drive for a WNCISSA basketball tournament spot in two home games during the coming week, facing Cherryville on Friday and Caroleen on Tuesday.

Coach Don Parker's quint remains in second place in South Group, Western AA Conference standings, slightly ahead of Rutherford - Spindale, perched in third place with an 8-2 record. Lincolnton is on top with a 10-2 record.

Rutherford - Spindale takes on Forest City at home Friday and moves to Shelby for a return engagement Tuesday. The third place team has lost only to Kings Mountain and Lincolnton.

The South Group's two tournament spots will most likely go to two of the three clubs now at the top of the ladder. The closest teams all now have six losses recorded in the books.

Kings Mountain finishes out the 16-game schedule against Lincolnton, Belmont and Shelby, R.-S. must also still face Forest City (in the second contest of the series), Lincolnton and Belmont. The school's 16th contest, not listed on the schedule, is evidently against Caroleen.

Kings Mountain defeated Cherryville there on January 19 by a score of 50-35 and downed Caroleen away 49-34.

The Kings Mountain girls team will be shooting for a second win over Cherryville, having posted their initial victory of the season at Cherryville on January 19 by 39-29, and will be gunning for a split on the season with Caroleen. Caroleen won the first meeting 57-42.
