RALEIGH - A varied program has been arranged for the North Carolina Press Association's first mechanical conference to be held at North Carolina State College Saturday and Sunday, March 13

and 14. Program details for the two-day conference were announced today by Macy Hoyle, mechanical superintendent of The Smithfield Herald and chairman of the conference's committee on arrangements.

The program, Hoyle said, was designed for the special benefit of the mechanical staffs of the state's newspapers.

Hoyle said the principal objective of the conference is to provide newspaper mechanical personnel opportunities for professional improvement such as are now offered editors, news photographers, news writers, and feature writers at similar conferences.
