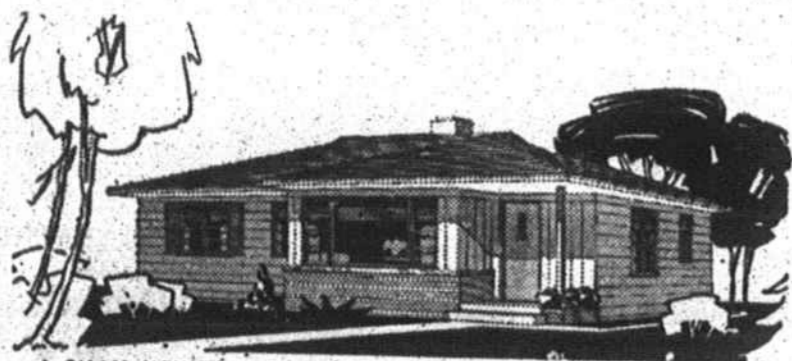

Driver Of Booze Car Sentenced

Nivans Plato Carpenter of York, S. C., drew a suspended sentence Monday afternoon in Recorder's court on charges of transporting non-tax paid liquor.

Carpenter pled guilty to the charges and Judge Jack White gave the defendant 18 months on the roads, suspended upon condition that he be of good behavior for 18 months.

According to Officer Paul Sanders, who collaborated with Officer Warren Ellison in making the arrest, 24 gallons of non-tax paid liquor was found in Carpenter's car after he had been apprehended March 18, at a road block at the intersection of York road and Bennett street.

Carl E. Childers of Cramerton and Alexander Gordon of Kings Mountain pled nolo contendere to driving drunk. Both defendants were given nine months on the roads, sentences suspended on condition that they be of good behavior for one year.

Two Negro women, Ophelia Wilson and Nina Mitchem, were found guilty of assault, and each defendant received 30 days in the county jail.

On passing sentence, Judge White remarked that this affray was simply a neighbor's squabble, which could have been settled out of court.

Donald Wilson, Jr., Negro, was found guilty as charged on the count of using profane language in a public place.

Victor Gillespie, who is fighting extradition to South Carolina, was ordered by Judge White to be held in the county jail for 30 days or until extradition papers are received by the Jailer.

Gillespie made bond of \$300.

Gillespie, arrested here on a fugitive warrant, according to Charles Gibson, Greenville, S. C., gave the Poinsetta Bonding Company of Greenville, S. C., a worthless check.

Three defendants were found guilty of public drunkenness. Two caes were confined and one captias was issued.

TO RETURN HOME CLARK AFB. — Now on his way to the United States on board the U. S. Naval Transport General Patrick is Airman Second Class Kenneth R. Cole, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. G. Cole, Box 421, Bessemer City.

The North Carolina airman recently completed a tour of duty with the U. S. Air Force in the Philippines. While stationed overseas, he was assigned to the 6424th Receiving, Shipping and Services Squadron Headquarters 6424th Air Depot Wing at Clark Air Force Base, 60 miles north of Manila.

A/2c Cole is returning to the United States for subsequent reassignment. Upon his arrival at the Zone of Interior, he will report at the 2349th Personnel Processing Center at Parks Air Force Base, California. From there, he will proceed to his new duty station at Patrick Air Force Base, Fla., where he is going to be assigned to Headquarters, Air Force Missile Test Center.

A graduate from Bessemer City High School, A/2c Cole enlisted in the U. S. Air Force in December 1951. He came to the Philippines in June 1952.

TO FAR EAST CAMP PENDLETON, Calif. — (FHTNC) — Marine Pvt. Donald F. Thompson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Thompson of 121 Oriental ave., Kings Mountain, N. C., scheduled to sail the latter part of March for duty in the Far East after spending four weeks in the staging regiment at this Marine Corps Base.
