Supreme Court to be a valid holographic will.

Of course, a person can destroy his will or change it before his death. If he wishes to change or add to it, he must either destory the old will and start over again, or, make what the law calls a "codicil," or addition to the original writing. This "codicil", howmust be signed and witnessed according to the same rules that apply to making the will itself,
