#### Winners Announced In Thursday Game

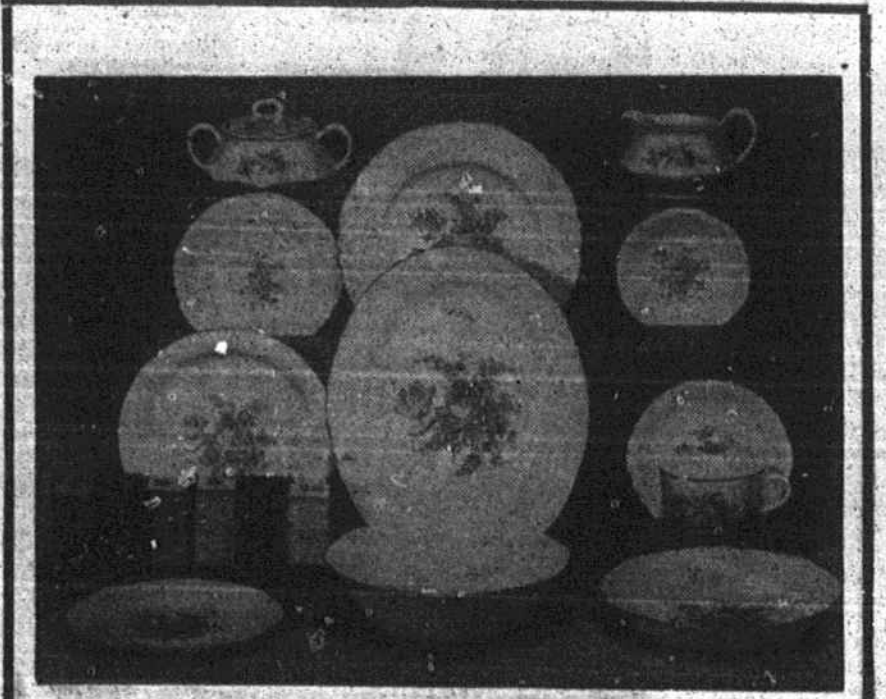
Winners in the duplicate bridge game played last Thursday night at Kings Mountain Country club have been announced by Mrs. C. E. Warlick.
