"Edison" Featured As House-of-Month
Many people, when they think of southern architecture, picture huge ante-bellum plantation houses with a row of tall graceful white columns. Such beautiful homes are truly southern, of course, but for every one such mansion there exist hundreds of more modest homes that are no less typically southern in their styling. Over the years they have acquired architectural characteristics that definitely stamp them with their southern origin, even though they are frequently built in other areas of the country.
Such a comfortable, middle-class southern home is "The Edison." Before the universality of the automobile, the inevitable big porch was usually on the front. Now, frequently, it is placed in the rear to overlook a quiet garden.
The architect's working drawings of this house, the current "House-of-the-Month", provide for either a partial basement or, as houses are more generally built in the south, with a utility room and extra storage space at floor level instead of a basement.
"The Edison" is one of scores of good house designs, every one by an outstanding architect that make up the master "House-of-
