Gear Grinders, the show is being held to raise funds for equipment in the organizations. Both are non-profit groups, he said.

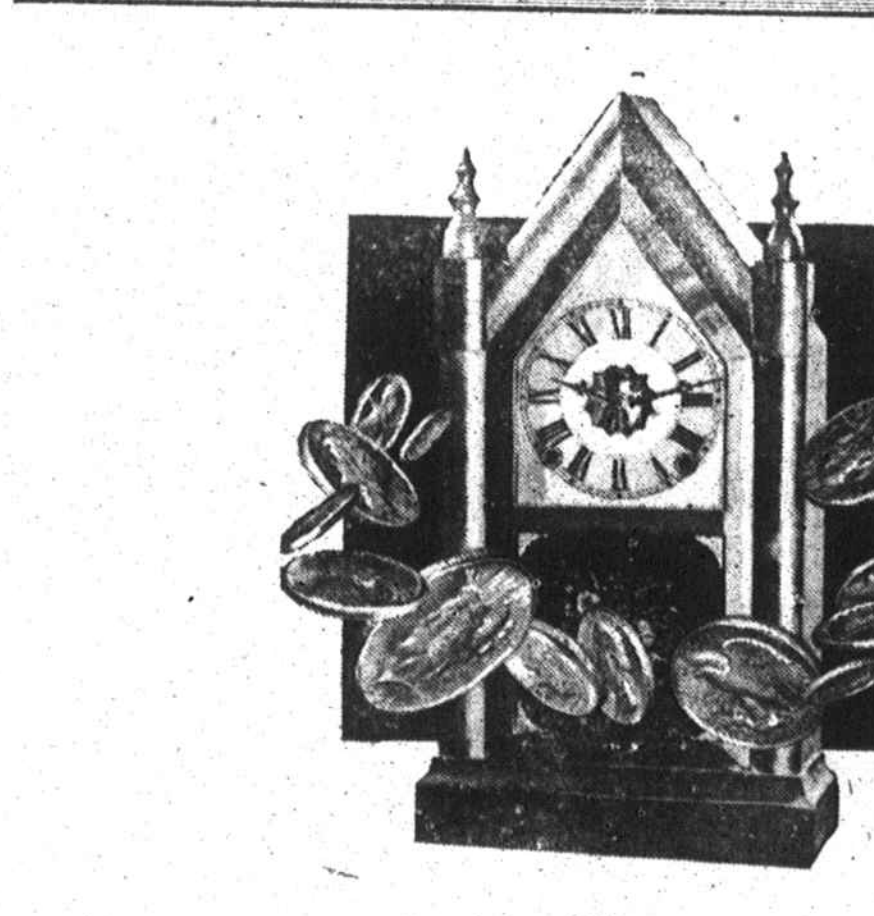
Mr. Mincey said there are 22 entries in addition to the new cars each Gastonia dealer will display. Trophies will be awarded to each car judged the best in its division.
