Airplane Contest Plans Announced

Plans for a model airplane contest, sponsored by the Recreation Commission, were announced this week.

The contest is open to all boys and girls, ages 9 through 16. Contestants who are interested must fill out an entry form, which may be obtained from the recreation commission and be submitted for judging by July 30.
