Q-How can I get in touch with a friend from the service

A-If you know any of the following: his service serial num-ber, his date of birth, his dates of entrance into and discharge from the service, the VA may be able to locate him if you have his full name, including middle name. The VA can then forward your letter to the veteran, since regulations forbid giving out a veteran's address.




