

"Just Trying Out Car" Resulted In Fines For Gastonian Monday

Two Kings Mountain Negroes—Jackie Hughes, 26, of 411 Childers street, and James W. Burris, 26, of 315 Waterson street, appealed sentenced meted out by Judge George Thomason in city recorder's court Monday.

The two-hour session required a recess for the judge and Solicitor William White to check the statutes in the case against the Hughes 1961 model Chevrolet allegedly used by the defendants in transporting 48 cans of beer and five pints of whiskey in warrants signed July 17. The auto was ordered sold, according to law, and both Burris and Hughes were handed down 90 day and 60 day suspended jail sentences which they appealed. Bond for Burris was set at \$300 and bond for Hughes was set at \$250. The defendants were informed they have the right to post bond of \$2500, twice the value of the car, which remains in custody of the police department.

Violation of liquor laws also resulted in sentences handed down to other defendants including:

Emmett S. Lee, 22, of route 1 and Franklin P. Childers, 21, of 112 North Oriental avenue, pled guilty to violation of prohibition laws and were given 30 day jail sentences, suspended on good behavior conditions and payment of \$5 fine and court costs.

Michael Lee Walker, 20, of 112 Benfield Drive, pled guilty to violation of prohibition laws for beverage purposes and was given a 30 day suspended sentence.

Fred L. Wright, Negro, was ordered to pay his wife \$195 representing non-support payments in arrears by August 28th or he would be returned to jail to finish out a sentence handed down for non-support.

Laverne Thompson, 23, Gastonia Negro, was given three suspended sentences following violation of motor vehicle laws, including no operator's license, improper registration, and no liability insurance.

The defendant testified he had bought a car and "was trying it out" when he was arrested during a routine "road check." Police said the car bore a license plate which the defendant admitted he had retrieved from a trash can.

Dudley Carroll Hughes, Jr., 19, of route two, was given a 30-day suspended sentence, his driver's license was revoked, according to

law, and he was ordered to attend driver's training school for four weeks after being found guilty of speeding 80 m.p.h. in a 35 m.p.h. zone.

The Tax Collector for the City of Kings Mountain is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to proceed to collect taxes levied upon all real and personal property within the limits of the City of Kings Mountain based upon the foregoing rates, provided that on all taxes paid in advance and discount be allowed and that on all taxes upon which cost, interest or penalties accrue, according to law the same shall be added and collected.

The City Treasurer is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to apportion the said funds coming into his hands from taxes collected for the fiscal year 1965-66, according to the rate and classification fixed in Section III.

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
