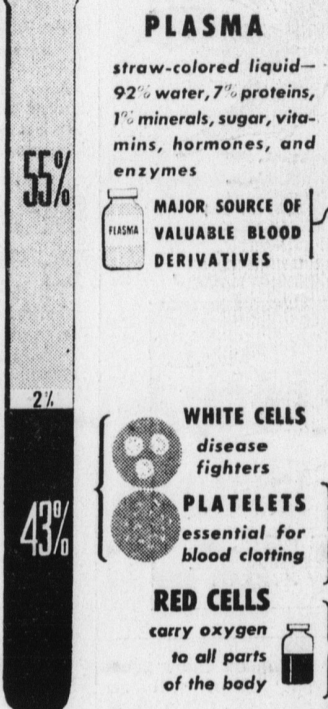
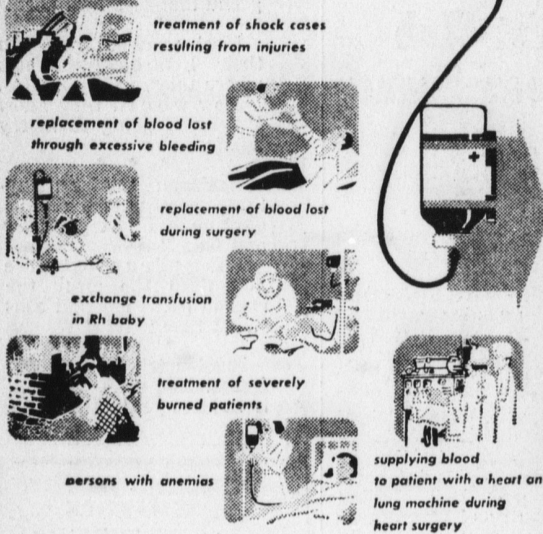

SERUM ALBUMIN
emergency treatment for shock; replacement of lost proteins as in kidney and liver diseases

GAMMA GLOBULIN
prevention and modification of measles and hepatitis; gamma globulin deficiencies

FIBRINOGEN
hemorrhaging in certain complications of child-birth

VACCINIA IMMUNE GLOBULIN
the only specific treatment for severe complications from vaccination

FRESH FROZEN PLASMA
control of bleeding in hemophilia

OTHER PLASMA FRACTIONS
being separated and uses being determined

for platelet deficiencies
