Game 3 — A. L. 6, N. L. 5, in a duel between Bob Feller and Dizzy Dean. Mel Ott hit a homer for the N. L. The A. L. won with a run in the ninth on singles by Frank Baker, Bill Dickey, and Cronin.

Game 4 — N. L. 9, A. L. 5, with Sandy Koufax the winner over Lefty Grove. Mays, Ott, and Pie Traynor hit homers for the N. L.

Game 5 — N. L. 4, A. L. 2, with Carl Hubbell defeating Eddie Plank. Rogers Hornsby led the N. L. with three singles. The A. L. averted a shutout with its runs in the ninth inning on a single by Babe Ruth, triple by Lou Gehrig and single by Baker.

Game 6 — N. L. 4, A. L. 1, in ten innings, with Johnson suffering second loss of the series, this time at the hands of Warren Spahn. 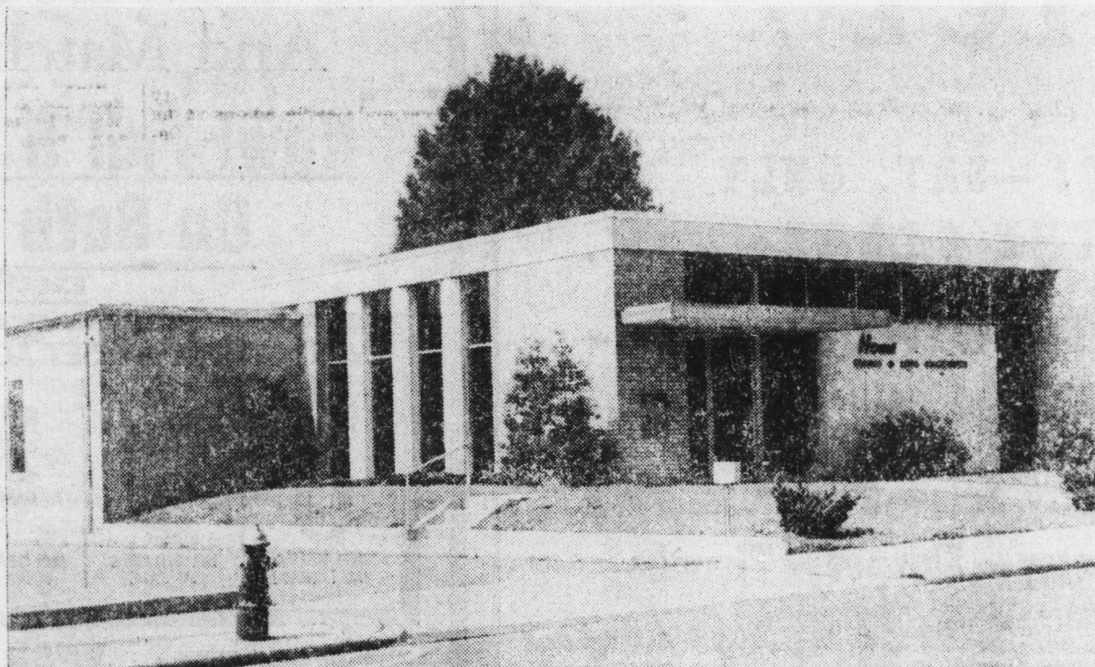
